# MIGRATING FROM AVALANCHE 4.6+ TO AVALANCHE 5.2

This document provides instructions for migrating to Avalanche 5.2 from versions of Avalanche (MC or SE) 4.6 and newer. To migrate from an earlier version of Avalanche, you must first migrate to a 4.6 or later release of Avalanche and then you will be able to move to version 5.2.

## MIGRATION

The following table provides information about which migrations are allowed with Avalanche 5.2:

Current version:	can migrate to:
Avalanche SE 4.7 or newer	Avalanche SE 5.2
Avalanche SE 5.2	Avalanche MC 5.2 with internal PostgreSQL databases*
Avalanche MC 4.6 or newer with PostgreSQL databases	Avalanche MC 5.2 with internal PostgreSQL databases
Avalanche MC 4.6 or newer with MS SQL Server 2005 databases	Avalanche MC 5.2 with MS SQL Server 2005 databases -OR- Avalanche MC 5.2 with MS SQL Server 2008 databases
Avalanche MC 5.0 or newer with MS SQL Server 2008 databases	Avalanche MC 5.2 with MS SQL Server 2008 databases

<sup>\*</sup> If you want to migrate to Avalanche MC 5.2 from an older version of Avalanche SE, you must migrate to Avalanche SE 5.2 first.

**NOTE:** If you are using Avalanche MC with external databases (MS SQL Server), please refer to *Migrating to Avalanche 5.2 with External Databases* for migration instructions. Cross-platform migration (e.g., from MS SQL Server to PostgreSQL) is not supported. If you are using Oracle databases, please contact Wavelink Customer Support for migration information.

The installer for Avalanche 5.2 backs up the database, profiles, and software packages, removes the previous version of Avalanche, and migrates your database and profiles to the new version. It also updates PostgreSQL (to version 9.0) and Tomcat (to version 7.0).

Once you have begun the migration, Wavelink strongly recommends that you not cancel or interrupt the migration process.

#### To migrate to Avalanche 5.2:

- 1. Back up your current version of Avalanche.
- 2. Obtain the Avalanche 5.2 installation file from the Wavelink Sales team and save it to the computer where Avalanche is currently installed.



- 3. Close other applications running on the computer.
- 4. Double-click the installation file to start the migration process.

An *Upgrade* dialog box appears indicating that there is a previous version of Avalanche installed on your system and asks if you want to upgrade.

5. Click Yes.

The Wavelink Avalanche InstallShield Wizard appears.

6. Click **Next** to continue the installation process.

The License Agreement screen appears.


7. Click **Yes** to agree with the terms of the License Agreement.

The Postgresql Super Account Password screen appears.

8. Specify a password for the PostgreSQL databases. This password must meet the domain password requirements set by your network administrator. **Retain this password for your records.** Type the password again to confirm and click **Next**.

The Organization Name screen appears.

- 9. Type the name of your company or organization and click **Next**.
  - If you are installing Avalanche SE, the Choose Destination Location screen appears. Go to step 10.
  - If you are installing Avalanche MC, the *Installation Options* screen appears.



- 10. Select which installation type you want to install and then click **Next**.
  - **Custom**. Allows you to choose which components to install. If you choose **Custom** and click **Next**, you will be prompted to select the desired components.



• **Enterprise**. Installs full support for distributed mobile device and infrastructure servers, the enterprise server, the statistics server, and the databases.

The Choose Destination Location screen appears.

11. Click Next to accept the default installation folder.

**NOTE:** Do not change the installation folder.

The database backup and removal of the previous version of Avalanche begins. The size of your database affects how long this takes. Do not cancel or interrupt the migration process. If the migration is interrupted, you may need to call Wavelink Customer Support.

NOTE: The following two dialog boxes only appear if you are migrating from Avalanche SE to Avalanche MC.


A dialog box appears reminding you to remove the previous version of Avalanche.

#### 12. Click **OK**.

A dialog box appears reminding you to remove the database when prompted. Removing the previous database will allow Avalanche to upgrade PostgreSQL to the latest version. The information in your database will be saved and reformatted to function with Avalanche 5.2.

#### 13. Click **OK**.

The older version of Avalanche is uninstalled and Avalanche 5.2 begins to install. The *Setup Status* screen appears.



14. When the installation is complete, click **Finish** to close the installer.



15. Open the Avalanche Console and perform a Universal Deployment to re-establish communications with your distributed servers.

Any deployed Mobile Device or Infrastructure Servers will be set to a dormant state, and will not attempt to communicate with the devices or the Enterprise Server until a Universal Deployment occurs. To upgrade the servers to the new version, you will need to create and deploy new server packages. When you create Infrastructure Servers, you must create the full deployment package, not the lightweight version.

The migrate.log file is created during the migration. This file provides you with a log of the migration process and a list of the components that were migrated. Review the migrate.log file located in the default installation directory for a complete list and details of all components migrated.

Once you install Avalanche 5.2, you may need to obtain new licensing based on your Mobile Device and Infrastructure licenses. Contact Wavelink Customer Service for more information.
